

Full-Text Search Cheat Sheet: FamilySearch.org

How to Sharpen Your Searches

Goal	How to Do It	Example	Effect
Find an exact word or phrase	Use quotation marks	"Henry Jones"	Only results with <i>Henry Jones</i> together.
Include a specific word	Use plus sign (+)	+Judith	Forces <i>Judith</i> to appear in results.
Exclude a specific word	Use minus sign (-)	-John	Removes results mentioning <i>John</i> .
Find different spellings	Use question mark (?) for 1 letter	Jens?n	Finds Jensen and Jenson.
Find word variations	Use asterisk (*) after the root	Car*	Finds <i>car</i> , <i>cars</i> , <i>carriage</i> , <i>carpenter</i> , etc.

X Bonus Tips

- Use Filters: After searching, use the filters on the upper left to narrow by:
 - Collection (e.g., Wills, Freedmen's Bureau)
 - Date range
 - Location
- Combine Techniques: Mix quotation marks, plus signs, and filters for maximum precision.
- Review the Document Itself: AI transcription can misread handwriting. Always verify!

📚 Example Advanced Search

Goal: Find Henry Jones but exclude references to John:

"Henry Jones" -John

Goal: Find someone whose name could be spelled Jensen or Jenson:

Jens?n

Goal: Find documents mentioning carriage, carpenter, or cars:

Car*

How to Search for Two Surnames Together

If you want to find documents where **both surnames appear**, you can:

• Use the plus sign (+) before each name

Example:

```
+Taylor +Burns
```

This search will **only return documents where both "Taylor" and "Burns" are mentioned**, even if they are not side-by-side.

• Use quotation marks if they must be together in a phrase

Example:

"Taylor Burns"

This search will only return documents where "Taylor Burns" appear exactly in that order, side-by-side.

Tip: Usually, using +Name +Name is better for finding both names anywhere in the document, especially in wills, deeds, and contracts where names may appear separately.

Why Use Full-Text Search?

Full-Text Search unlocks mentions buried deep inside unindexed documents like:

- Wills
- Probate inventories
- Freedmen's Bureau records
- Deeds and land claims

Perfect for finding enslaved ancestors, lost family members, or hidden community connections.
